

It's the law! Divert food scraps from the trash.

In Vermont, as of July 1, 2020, food scraps are banned from going to the landfill. So, what do we do with them?

- Compost them in your backyard, or
- Dump them in the transfer station's food scrap can (free), or
- Pay someone to pick them up at your house.

You can continue to throw meat, bones, and grease into the trash OR you can bring them to the transfer station where they will go to a commercial compost facility. Do **Not** add meat and bones to your backyard composter—they will attract vermin.
